Safety Precautions

Please read the following safety instructions carefully. It is advised that you keep this manual for future references

- 1. All cautions and warnings on the device should be noted.
- 2. Make sure the power source matches the power rating of the device.
- 3. Position the power cord so that people cannot step on it. Do not place anything over the power cord.
- 4. Always completely disconnect the power before working on the system's hardware.
- 5. No connections should be made when the system is powered as a sudden rush of power may damage sensitive electronic components.
- 6. If the device is not to be used for a long time, disconnect it from the power supply to avoid damage by transient over-voltage.

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Chapter 1

Hardware Installation

1.1 Hardware Requirements

- 1. AAEON vending I/O board
- 2. AAEON computing board
- 3. USB 2.0 cable, type A to type B
- 4. USB interface camera
- 5. 24vDC Motor
- 6. USB interface QR Code device
- 7. Cashless RF ID device (optional)
- 8. Temperature (One-ware) (optional)
- 9. Bill machine (MEI NV9 USB) (optional)
- 10. Coin machine (MEI CF7000) (optional)

Display resolution supports 1080*1920 (Full HD)



Step 1: Connect the AAEON vending I/O board.

Step 2: Plug the type B end of the included USB cable in to the USB type B connector on bottom board of the AAEON vending I/O board.



Step 3: Plug the type A end of the included USB cable in to one of the USB type A connectors (any USB connector is fine) on the AAEON computing board.




Step 4: Plug the HDMI cable * from your monitor * in to the HDMI connector on the AAEON computing board.



Step 5: Plug the Keyboard and Mouse USB cable(s)* or dongle* from your Keyboard and Mouse* in to any USB connector on the AAEON vending computing board.



Step 6: Please make sure the Camera cable and QR code cable are well connected as per following image.




Step 7: Plug the 5VDC power cable in to the CN10 connector on the AAEON vending I/O board.








Step 8: Turn on the UP system and it will turn on the Intel vending API automatically. **Step 9:** Plug the barrel end of the 5V power cable in to the power connector on the AAEON computing board.



Step 10: Plug the 6-pin in-line end of the 24V DC input power cable in to the CN4 connector on the AAEON vending I/O board.



Step 11: Plug the barrel plug of the 24V power supply to the barrel end of the 24V power cable that's connected to the AAEON computing board.



Step 12: Plug the AC power cord in to the 24V DC power supply's receptacle. Now plug the 24V DC power supply's AC cord plug in to an 110V AC outlet.



You have now completed connecting the AAEON Intelligent Vending Development Kit. The AAEON computing board and I/O board will power up. You should now see a blue LED on the AAEON computing board light up; the monitor will show an Up startup screen and then boot to Windows.


You have completed Chapter 1: setting up the hardware. Now that you have finished setting up the hardware, please proceed to Chapter 2 to set up the software configuration for the Intelligent Vending development kit

Note:

- 1. Please make sure all the adapters are well connected with the power cords.
- 2. Check the power cord is fully plugged into the power outlet.
- 3. Due to the power relay, it is completely normal to hear a small clicking sound when the machine is powered on.

1.3 Intelligent Vending Development Installation - Motor setup

The AAEON Intelligent Vending Development Kit demos a motor with forward and reverse direction. Please use the cable in the packing list and follow the instructions to make a connection between 24Vdc motor and AAEON Vending I/O board.



Remark

Please note that motor to drink item connections are one-to-one relationships (one drink item will only connect with one motor). For example, if the AAEON Vending Demo Kit program uses "Coke" mapping for the motor, only a selection of "Coke" can turn on this motor.


Step 7: Open the device manager and expand the "Ports (COM and LPT)" section. The device manager shows COM3 as the port. Then edit the XML file. The text in bold in the picture below shows the edits made in this particular instance.

Step 8: Synchronize internet time server by following these steps:

- 1. Right click the clock in the lower right-hand corner (Windows System Tray)
- 2. Select "Adjust date/time" and the Settings menu will open
- 3. Click "Add clocks for different time zones"
- 4. Open the "Internet Time" tab
- 5. Click "Change settings"
- 6. Click "Update Now"
- 7. Click "OK" to accept settings. The system will automatically synchronize on a regular basis.

Note: Make sure the system is connected to the internet before attempting internet time server synchronization.

Camera Facial Recognition Setup


3.1 Installation

Pre-step: Please follow this link

https://azure.microsoft.com/en-us/try/cognitive-services/, then choose "Get API Key" and click on "Next" to receive the API Key.


When you finish the sign-in process, the image below will show on your screen. Copy Key 1 to and Endpoint link as seen in the image below.

Note Free Facial recognition service is limited to a maximum of 30,000 transactions, 20 per minute.



Please follow the steps below to set up the camera API in order to enable facial recognition.

- **Step 1:** Go to the VendingCamaera directory and open LiveCameraSample.exe. and then configure LiveCameraSample
- Step 2: Start "LiveCameraSample"
- Step 3: Show settings
- Step 4: Paste Key 1 in Face API Key field and Endpoint link in FaceEndpoint field.
- Step 5: Enable "Preview Window"
- **Step 6:** Set (x,y,w,h) values for preview window.
- Step 7: Enable "AutoStart From Default Camera"
- Step 8: Press "Save" to save the settings.
- Step 9: Restart Face API program before running VendingDemo.exe



After changing the settings, please go to the VendingDemo kit directory and double-click VendDemo.exe. This file loads the sample vending application.

Note:

- 1. Please make sure the Internet cable is connected before running facial recognition
- 2. A face must be detected within the green column, and the camera API will count for 2 seconds to make sure the USB interface camera is detecting properly as per the image below.





After the camera has detected a face, the Vending Demo API will make a recommendation based on detection result.
