

Before using your device, please read through the following instructions

- Use only the power adapter that comes with your device. Using a different power adapter may cause damage.
- The AC power cord is designed for the RTC-710RK only.
- This product is intended to be supplied by a Listed Power Adapter or DC power source, rated 12Vdc, 3A minimum, Tma = 40°C. Please contact AAEON for further assistance
- Using a power outlet is the best way to charge your device (refer to section 1.2 for the power adapter's voltage output and acceptable input).
- When using the device for the first time, fully charge the battery for up to 8 hours. If the device is inactive, charging the battery once per month is recommended to prevent battery life deterioration.
- There are two batteries in the RTC-710RK: Both batteries can be monitored at the title bar). Charge the device once Hot-swappable battery drops below 20%.
- Always allow your battery to be fully charged before use.
- To prolong battery life, allow a fully charged battery to discharge more than 95% before recharging.
- Ensure that the battery cover is properly secured by manually pushing the pin to lock position.
- The RTC-710RK CANNOT be charged via an USB connection.
- The IP65 waterproof protection may get damaged when subjected to shock greater than levels tested in MIL-STD-810G Method 516.6 Procedure IV. The protection may also be affected if the rubber connector fails to cover or close firmly.

2.3 Turning on the Device

The power button turns your device on and off. Hold the button for one second to power on.

To start or wake from sleep mode, hold the power button for 0.5 seconds until the shutdown confirmation is shown. If the system remains unresponsive, press and hold the power button to force power off (may result in data loss). It is strongly recommended that the user back up important data regularly.


Insert the Battery Pack and make sure the battery cover is securely locked. The initial booting sequence may take several minutes to complete.

2.4 Setting the Function Keys


This section details how you can set the programable Function Keys, F1 and F2. The default settings are listed in the Product Overview. To begin, launch the AAEON Hot Key App.




In the main menu you will find the two programable keys. F1 is Hot Key 1 and F2 is Hot Key 2. Select the key you wish to modify.




Both keys can be set to one of three main functions: App, Web, and KeyCode.




App allows you to set the hot key to launch any app that is installed on the device.

KeyCode will allow you to set the hot key to perform a specified action based on Android key codes.



- 3. If the scanner is working, the code will be entered as text into Notepad

Frequently Asked Questions

4.1 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1. What is the default storage path for downloaded software?

The default path is: sdcard/download.

2. How do you disable the auto stand-by function?

Select Settings-> Display-> Sleep-> Never.

3. How to configure input methods?

After installing the input app, select Settings-> System -> Language & Input-> Default-> Setup input methods-> Select an Input method.

4. How to disable screen lock?

Select Settings->Security->Screen Lock->None

5. How to speed up GPS?

Select Setting-> Turn on Location access-> Check GPS Satellites-> Check WiFi & mobile network location

6. How to take screenshots?

Select Setting-> Screenshot. The photos will be saved to Image/ Screenshot.

7. How to uninstall applications?

Select Settings-> Apps-> Select application -> Uninstall.

8. How to change the home screen wallpaper?

Select Settings-> Display-> Wallpaper-> Select the image file you wish to use as a wallpaper.

9. How to remove shortcuts from the home screen?

Long press the app shortcut until the Remove icon "X" appears at the top of the home screen. Drag and drop the app onto the "X" to remove the shortcut from home screen. (Note: This will not uninstall the app.)

10. How to add a shortcut to the home screen?

Long press the app from the app drawer and drag it to the home screen

11. How to stop the screen from rotating automatically?

Select Settings->Display->Uncheck "Auto-rotate screen".

12. How to start GPS services?

Select Settings-> Location access-> Enable Access to my location-> Check GPS Satellites.

13. How to change the default browser homepage?

Launch Browser-> Select the icon at the top right corner of the browser-> Settings-> General Settings-> Homepage

If you are using a battery pack for the first time and notice rust, bad smell, or something abnormal (ex: inflated), DO NOT USE the battery pack. Contact the vendor for immediate replacement.

7. Leakage

If the battery pack is leaking and the fluid comes in contact with clothing or skin, immediately wash with fresh water. The battery fluid may cause skin irritation.

8. Storage Conditions

When storing a battery pack for long periods of time, store in a dry place with no exposure to corrosive gases, within the following temperature ranges:

Less than 1 month, -20°C to 50°C

Less than 3 months, -20°C to 40°C

Less than 1 year, -20°C to 20°C

Check regularly to ensure there is no condensation on the battery pack.

9. Long Term Storage Maintenance

When storing battery packs for long periods of time, in order to maintain battery pack life and charging capability, the battery pack should be charged to 50% capacity every 30-45 days.

If the battery pack remains in under-voltage state for a long time, DO NOT use fast charging. It is recommended that you ship the battery to AAEON for inspection before use.

- 10. Do not use the battery pack if any part of it is protruding or inflated. Replace with a new battery pack immediately.
- 11. If the battery pack cannot be charged (won't hold a charge, system is unable to charge it), replace the battery pack with a new one immediately.
